Thoughts from Reverend Doug

June is our national Pride month! It is also the 50th anniversary of the event that gave birth to Pride celebrations. On June 28, 1969, New York City police raided the Stonewall Inn gay bar. Tensions between police and gay residents of the Greenwich Village area in which Stonewall was located had been brewing for several weeks. The police raid of the bar, and their arrest of its gay patrons (just for simply being in a gay bar) quickly got out of hand. Patrons and other neighborhood residents resisted police efforts to arrest and harass them.

Over the next few nights, protests grew larger and even more angry. Within weeks, protesters coalesced into groups that became the nucleus of the gay rights movement that still exists today. LGBTQ persons and their allies owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to the men and women of the first Stonewall Inn protests and to the even greater number of people who have advocated for equal rights since then.

Despite the fact that Pride month is often seen as a time to celebrate LGBTQ equality, I believe it must also be a time to champion basic human rights for everyone. The rainbow Pride flag is emblematic of that. We cannot advocate rights for some - but not for all. Every person must be accorded equality and dignity due to the simple fact that we are all of the same human family.

As a part of that ethic is the idea that Pride means outwardly living true to one's inner identity. No longer should anyone have to suppress or deny who they are, and who they choose to love, because others disagree or simply choose to hate. And that means we all must be authentic in who we are to the world. No matter our differences, Pride is a way to affirm and love not only ourselves and who we were created to be, but to also love and support all others in who they were created to be.

Women, people of color, and the other abled are an essential part of the rainbow spectrum of human diversity. Each of our individual differences do not make us less equal or less beautiful. Instead, diverse ethnicities, backgrounds, genders, sexualities and abilities make us each wonderfully unique "works of art" crafted by the creator.

I hope you will take time this month to reflect on June Pride and how you too can share in its celebration. That includes Pride in who you are and the special but unique qualities you offer the world. And it means Pride in the wide and wonderful human family - one that is knit together by a common spirit of love, compassion and mutual understanding. We owe such Pride to ourselves and then to family, friend, and stranger!

Donations Needed by Valley Interfaith

VICRC in Lockland is dependent on donated items. Many needed items are difficult for Valley to purchase due to either high cost or limited availability. Consider picking up a few of their most needed items and dropping them off at GNH. Place them in the large basket by the stairs in the foyer outside the Quimby Room.

Most needed pantry items include empty plastic containers to distribute laundry soap, all kinds of cereal, peanut butter, and canned meat.

Most needed personal hygiene items include toothbrushes, toothpaste, men's and women's deodorant, body wash, shampoo, cleaning products, garbage bags, unscented hypoallergenic power laundry soap, feminine hygiene products, size 4-6 diapers and any size pull-ups, and toilet paper. Drug stores, like CVS and Walgreens, often have special deals on these items.

Most needed clothing and house wares items include men's jeans (especially small sizes), men's gym shoes and boots (new or gently used), gently used pots and pans, new or gently used queen and king sheet sets, bath towels, new or gently used window box fans, and new or gently used space heaters.
